


PEAK G Pre-Assessment Script and Stimuli Guide:

Place the booklet between the learner and the assessor.







Present pictures of cubes in three orders. Say, "Which one is in order from biggest to smallest?"

Say, "Point to the stop sign."








Point to the dot, then slide your finger along the red arrow to the X, and say, "What is the distance in miles from the dot to the X along the red line?"

Say, "Give this a name based on what it is used for."


Say, "I'm thinking of something that has four legs, stripes, and a tail. What is it?"

Read three statements, "It will rain today. I am hungry. I need an umbrella!" and say, "Which one doesn't belong in the story?"










Say, "Which colors will make this color?".

Sara has either eaten an apple or a cookie. She didn't eat an apple.






Present and read the riddle, "Sara has either eaten an apple or a cookie. She didn't eat an apple. What did she eat?"
